Proposed Action Description:			
This Categorical Exclusion Determination (CXD) addresses specific activities which can be performed at locations associated with Pantex Plant pertaining to safety, health, and environmental improvements. The types of activities within the scope of this review would be: modifications to an existing structure to enhance workplace habitability; installation of, or improvements to, building and equipment instrumentation; installation of, or improvements to, equipment for personnel safety and health; and safety and environmental improvements to a facility, including replacement and upgrade of facility components, that do not result in a significant change in the expected useful life, design production capacity, or function of the facility, and during which operations may be suspended and then resumed. Categorical Exclusions to be used for the various activities include: 10 CFR 1021, Appendix B, Sections B2.1 Workplace enhancements, B2.2 Building and equipment instrumentation, B2.3 Personnel safety and health equipment, B2.4 Equipment qualification, B2.5 Facility safety and environmental improvements, and B2.6 Recovery of radioactive sealed sources. This review may be used for either type of activity and not written to be all inclusive, and is generically written as a tiered document for routine Plant activities. Although routine activities may tier off of this document, they would be evaluated on an individual basis. If a project were to have the potential for environmental impacts, a project -specific NEPA Review Form would be prepared to include those factors.
